

Bill Kaiser - 1985

Bill Kaiser's involvement with the game of golf began as a caddie at Cherokee Golf Course in Louisville, where he later became assistant golf professional. He left Cherokee to become head golf professional at Jeffersonville Country Club in Indiana. Kaiser played on the PGA Tour from 1931-1955. While on Tour, Kaiser joined the Hillerich and Bradsby Company in 1933, and began a long career primarily promoting PowerBilt golf clubs. His remarkable success in gaining his company recognition and respect earned him the nickname "Mr. PowerBilt." His victories include three Kentucky Open titles (1934, 1938, 1939).
