



Judge John Marshall, Jr. - 1984

John Marshall Jr. was the son of a former Lieutenant Governor of Kentucky and the best known name in Kentucky Golf for nearly a half century as a player and administrator. Marshall was educated at Williams College and Harvard Law School, and was runner-up in the National Intercollegiate Golf Championship in 1913 and a semi-finalist two years later. Marshall, known as “Judge”, was appointed judge of chancery division in Jefferson County Circuit Court in 1931 and in 1934 became the standing master in chancery of the United States District Court for Western Kentucky. Marshall won the first of his four Kentucky State Amateur titles in 1914 at the age of 19. He Served as President of the Kentucky State Golf Association for eleven years from 1940 through 1951 and was the Executive Secretary from 1951-1962. He also served as a USGA Committee Member for many years. When he officially severed his ties with the Kentucky State Golf Association in 1962, he ended 48 years of invaluable service to amateur golf in Kentucky.
