

"Uncle" Joe Dickson Award

Established in 1964, this award honors the low public links scorer in the Kentucky State Amateur Championship. The award was presented annually from 1964-1980, and was re-instituted in 2006.

The award is named in honor of the late "Uncle" Joe Dickson, a member of the Kentucky Golf Hall of Fame, and in his time, recognized as one of the foremost promoters of public golf in the United States. He was instrumental in bringing the 1932 U.S. Public Links Championship to Shawnee Golf Course in Louisville, as well as the 1950 U.S. Public Links Championship to Seneca Golf Course in Louisville.
